THIS AGREEMENT, entered into this 26 day of March 1926, A.D. and between the Board of Trustees of Sharon Township, Franklin County, Ohio, by its President and Clerk thereunto duly authorized by resolution of said Board, and the Worthington Savings Bank Co., of Worthington, Ohio, WITNESSETH:

Whereas, said The Worthington Savings Bank is the only bank located in Sharon Township and is conveniently located to the Treasurer of said Township and is deemed by said Trustees to be a safe depository for the funds of said Board coming into the hands of the Treasurer of said Township, which office is now held by the Township Clerk, under the law taking effect Jan. 1st, 1924, and

And Whereas, said Bank has offered to act as depository for the funds of said Township for a period of two years beginning January 1, 1926, and to pay interest on the average daily balances of such funds deposited with it at the rate of two and one-half per cent per annum

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Township Trustees of Sharon Township, Franklin County, Ohio, hereby designated The Worthington Savings Bank Company, of Worthington, Ohio, to be the legal depository for funds of said Township coming into the hands of the Treasurer-Clerk thereof during the period of two years from and after January 1st, 1926, and
