The first meeting of 1955 was called to order by the Deputy Clerk.

The following were present: Trustees Warren E. Insley, John D. Loomis and M. L. Thomas; and Deputy Clerk Charles D. Wing.

The Deputy Clerk asked for nominations for a chairman and a vice-chairman.

Mr. Insley nominated Mr. Thomas as Chairman and Mr. Loomis as Vice-Chairman, and moved that the nominations be closed and the Clerk instructed to cast a unanimous ballot for each nominee.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Loomis and carried, Mr. Insley, Mr. Loomis and Mr. Thomas voting "aye" on roll call.

Mr. Loomis moved that the compensation of Merlin Denig, Road Superintendent, be set at \$45.00 per week for the fiscal year 1955 for time spent in the performance of his duties, and that said compensation be paid from the Road & Bridge Fund, and that Mr. Denig's bond be set at \$200~~0~~.00. (~~\$~~200.00)

The motion was seconded by Mr. Insley, and the roll being called on the motion the vote resulted as follows: Mr. Insley, aye; Mr. Loomis, aye; Mr. Thomas, aye. The motion carried.

Mr. Thomas moved that Merlin Denig be designated Superintendent of Flint Cemetery. The motion was seconded by Mr. Loomis and carried, Mr. Insley, Mr. Loomis and Mr. Thomas voting "aye" thereon.

Mr. Insley moved that the Road Superintendent be authorized to employ such assistants as he may deem necessary and that the same be compensated at a rate set by said Superintendent not to exceed \$1.75 per hour for a foreman and \$1.50 per hour for other help.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Loomis, and the roll being called on the motion the vote resulted as follows: Mr. Insley, aye; Mr. Loomis, aye; Mr. Thomas, aye. The motion carried.

Mr. Insley introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption:

## RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Trustees of Sharon Township, Franklin County, Ohio:

SECTION 1. That O. J. Barker and Norman Severance be designated as Police Constables of Sharon Township.

SECTION 2. That the compensation of Constable Severance be set at \$3.50 per call answered in performance of his duties as a Police Constable; and that the compensation of Constable Barker be set \$3600.00 per year for the performance of his duties as a Police Constable, provided, however, that said Constable Barker shall provide a police cruiser at his own expense and shall spend at least eight (8) hours per day in patrolling roads, keeping the peace, and protecting property.


WHEREAS, "bingo" in any form is an open violation of state laws in Sharon Township,

Dear Sir:

We are in receipt of your letter of January 10, 1955, relative to proposed contracts for fire protection and emergency service to be furnished Columbus by adjoining townships.

This is only one of the many problems faced by metropolitan Columbus and Franklin County, others being the water and sewage problems, police protection, zoning, etc.

We feel all of these problems can be solved on a common basis through mutual cooperation of Columbus and the other townships and villages in the metropolitan area.

However, in view of Columbus' arbitrary attitude in regard to the sewage and water problems, the Sharon Township Trustees are unwilling to enter into the fire protection and emergency contract suggested by the City of Columbus until the City is ready to cooperate in solving the sewage and water and other common problems.

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The Deputy Clerk was instructed to write a letter to the County Engineer requesting 4 "Dead End Signs" and a street marker sign lettered "Sunnyside Lane".

Constable Barker submitted his report, which was filed.


