The following were present: Trustees, John D. Loomis, Earl B. Smith, Melvin L. Thomas; Road and Flint Cemetery Supt, Merlin T. Denig; Constables, Orban J. Barker and Norman C. Severance; Clerk, Eleanor A. Bierly.

The first meeting of the year 1960 was called to order by the township clerk.

Oath of office for clerk, Eleanor A. Bierly was officiated by Mr. John D. Loomis. Oath of office for Trustee, John D. Loomis was officiated by Eleanor A. Bierly.

The December 16, 19, 29, minutes were re-read and and 29th minutes approved.

Clerk asked for nominations from the floor for the Chairman and Vice-Chairman.

Mr. Loomis nominated Mr. Smith as Chairman and Mr. Thomas as Vice-Chairman and moved that the nominations be closed add that the clerk be instructed to cast an unanimous vote for each nominee. The motion was seconded by Mr. Thomas and carried. All voted "aye" thereon.

Trustees set the first and third Wednesday of each month at Sharon Township Hall, time 7:30 P.M. as the regular meeting nights.

Clerk submitted the Financial Fudn report for 1959.

Franklin County Budget Commission letter received and stated that this township would receive \$7,500.00 of the Local Government Sales Tax money.

War Memorial Building Financial Statement was received from Sec. John T. Gray.

Mr. Thomas was requested to contact Mr. George Thormyer regarding their ideas regarding the purchasing of the township hall, etc.

A special meeting is to be called for January 14, 1960 for the purpose of discussing the Base Radio Station which will be needed at the Fire House. Those requested to be present are, Trustees, Fire Chief, Richard Netting and Henry E. Smith.

Mr. Russell E. Eicher appeared before the board and discussed an "All Risk Tools Floater Insurance Policy" for all township road and cemetery tools and equipment. Road Supt. Denig made a list of the road and cemetery tools and equipment and submitted same to Mr. Eicher. An all risk floater policy in the amount of \$1,279.00 will be submitted at the January 27, meeting for approval.

The Flint Cemetery Building Insurance was discussed, Mr. Loomis moved, seconded by Mr. Thomas that the \$900.00 Fire and extended coverage policy be purchased in the premium amount of \$30.65. All voted "aye" thereon.

The Ohio Convention of Township Trustees and clerks will be held January 20-23, 1960. The regular meeting will be held January 27, 1960. Mr. Thomas moved, seconded b Mr. Loomis that all expenses to and from and during the convention for those attending be paid. All voted "aye" there on.

The Road Supt. reported on all work, and stated the need for two "DEAD END" or "NO OUTLET" signs, 2 9' steel posts

for York Canyon Drive and Strimple Avenues. Clerk is to write a letter of authorization to the Franklin County Engineers so that one of the road crew can pick them up.

Road Supt. reported that the War Memorial Driveway had been graded, that 17 foot of tile on an alley at Flint had been laid, that McCampbell and Flint area ditched has been cleaned, that Strimple Road dead trees had been removed, that Westview tree limbs had been trimmed, that 31 openings 10-12 ft. cuts between hildreth and Cleveland Avenue on Homeacre Drive had been made to let drainage water flow and that the ditch along the south side of that road has been cleaned.

The three trustees, road supt. set January 9, 1960 to view the Westview area ditches.

Mr. Loomis moved, seconded by Mr. Thomas that Merlin T. Denig be redesignated as Sharon Township Road Superintendent and Flint Cemetery Superintendent, and that his compensation be set at \$55.00 per week for his duties (\$27.50 Gas Tax - \$27.50 Flint Cemetery) as superintendent. Mr. Denigs bond to be set at \$1,000.00; that he be authorized to employ such help as he may deem necessary and that the same be compensated at a rate set by him not to exceed \$1.75 per hour. All voted "aye" thereon.

Mr. Loomis moved, seconded by Mr. Thomas that the Trustees designate the following sale price for graves at the F Flint Cemetery as set at the February 1, 1957 meeting.

That the charge for opening and closing a grave be set at a fee of \$35.00 - Adult, \$25.00 childs grave. Indigent residents price be \$35.00 for opening and closing a grave.

Mr. Thomas moved, seconded by Mr. Loomis that Harold A. Morgan be re-employed for 1960, as the Sharon Township Fire Station Custodian, that the custodian be compensated \$225.00 per month; payable 1st and 15th of each month; that he have two weeks vacation with pay; that the custodian obtain a reliable person to take charge during this two week vacation period for \$100.00; that he employ the custodian relief one day a week not to exceed \$10.00 per week. All voted "aye" thereon.

Mr. Loomis moved, seconded by Mr. Thomas that Jerry Cunningham and L. F. Sanford be re-employed as Fire House Custodians under the direction of Fire Chief L. C. Brown as set forth in the April 5, 1959 minutes, rules and regulations. All voted "aye" thereon.

Mr. Loomis moved, seconded by Mr. Thomas what Mr. Lawrence C. Brown be re-appointed as Sharon Township Fire Chief for 1960; that his compensation be set at \$150.00 per month. All voted "aye" thereon.

Mr. Thomas moved, seconded by Mr. Loomis that the Assistant Fire Chief be paid \$25.00 per month for his duties as Assistant Fire Chief in charge of the Squad. All voted "aye". April 15, 1959 minutes



This notice will be attached to all county building permits as of February 4, 1959.

Minutes of the January 14th meeting were reread and approved. January 27th minutes were read and approved.

A letter from the Veterans Service Office regarding the burial of a Adam Faye Green in 1918-1919 was received and returned to the Flint Cemetery Supt. to check for said burial. No record of "Adam Faye Green" has been recorded. Clerk is to return notice informing them.

Flint Supt. and Trustees discussed the purchase of some additional land at Flint Cemetery. Mr. Leggs has 35 acres. The land will be viewed later.

Road Supt. reported that a new tile should be laid on the southside of Westview west of Riverside Drive. Mr. Loomis moved, seconded by Mr. Thomas th t the tile be installed. All voted "aye" thereon.

Road Supt. reported that the grader needed new tires. He is to check prices for tires and report to the Trustees.

The driveway rightaway permit issued by the county building department was discussed, and the following resulted:

Driveway Tile Policy

#5543.16 Owners must install and fill at his own expense when connecting to any township road; grade, drainage and installation to be approved by the Sharon Township Road Superintendent. Size of tile to be atleast 10".

Fire Chief Brown reported on fire department matters. Reported that he had spoken to his officers and custodians regarding their duties and the need to inspire complete cooperation thru out the department.

A letter dated January 31, 1960 was received from nine members of the Sharon Township Volunteer Fire Department regarding the color of the new 1960 Emergency Squad Truck. 


The April 6th minutes were reviewed regarding the members present and remodeling discussed.



"The board of township trustees may establish all necessary regulations to guard against the occurrence of fires, to protect the property and lives of the citizens against damage and accidents and may, with the approval of the specifications by the prosecuting attorney, purchase or otherwise provide such fire apparatus mechanical resuscitators or other equipment, appliances, materials, fire hydrants, and water supply for fire-fighting purposes as seems advisable to the board."






